Creighton Prep Sophomore Wins State Oratorical Contest

Lincoln (January 23, 2024) – Joshua Mammen, a Sophomore at Creighton Prep High School, earned first place at the 85th annual American Legion Oratorical Contest held on January 20th at the Holiday Inn in Kearney. He was awarded a check from the Nebraska American Legion for \$1,000.

The competition includes an eight to ten-minute rehearsed speech on an aspect of the Constitution by each competitor and then a three to five-minute speech on an assigned article of the Constitution.

Ella Brenneman, homeschool, placed second and was awarded \$600; Esten Johnsen, Seward High School placed third and was awarded \$400; and Reagan Choat, Plainview High School, placed fourth and was awarded \$200.

Mammen will now compete in Hillsdale, Michigan at the National Oratorical Finals in May against state champions from across the United States, France, and Germany. The first day of competition will narrow the field of participants down to the “Final Three” who will square off against each other the following day. The three finalists will receive scholarships of \$25,000, \$22,500, and \$20,000 from The American Legion.
